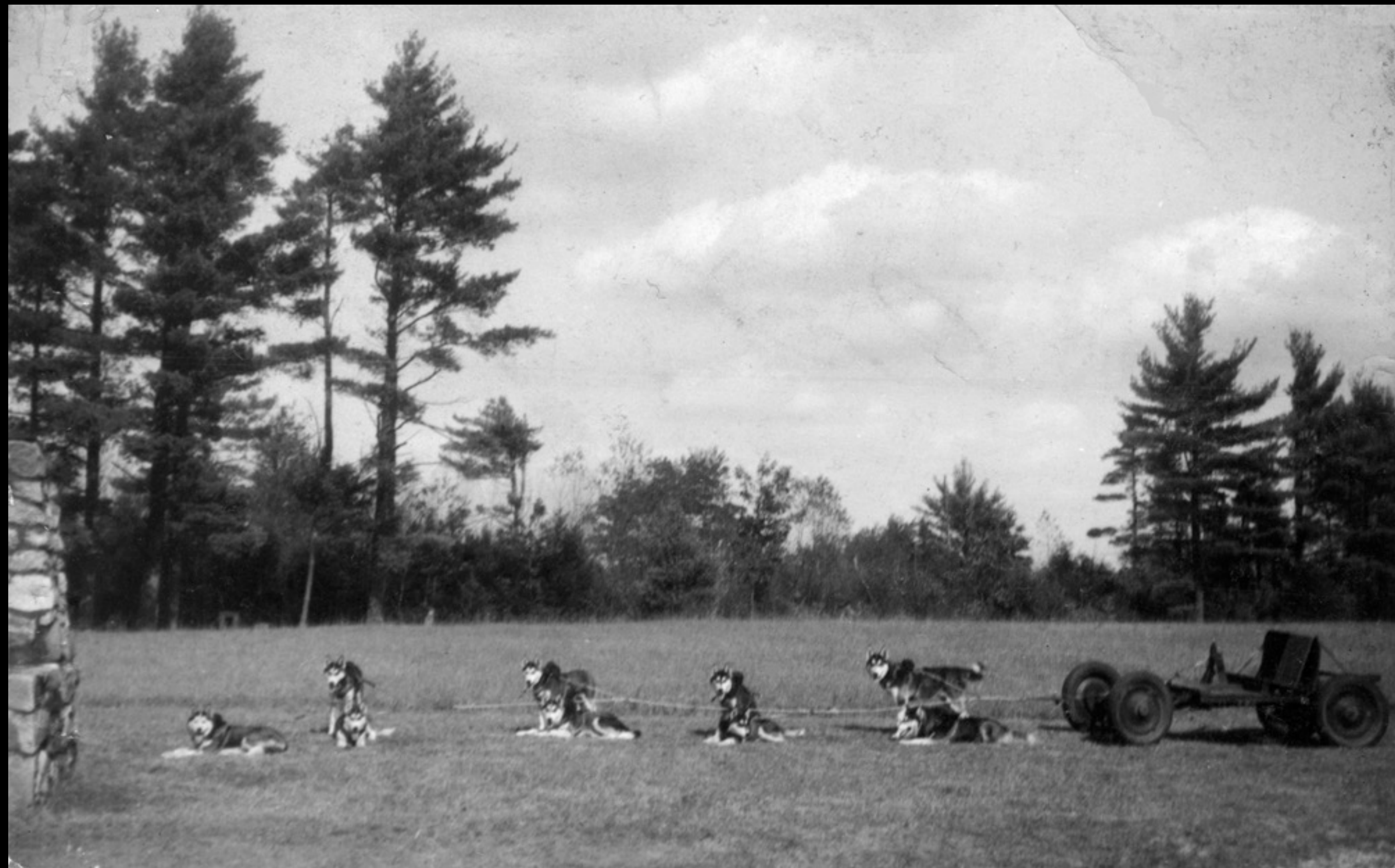

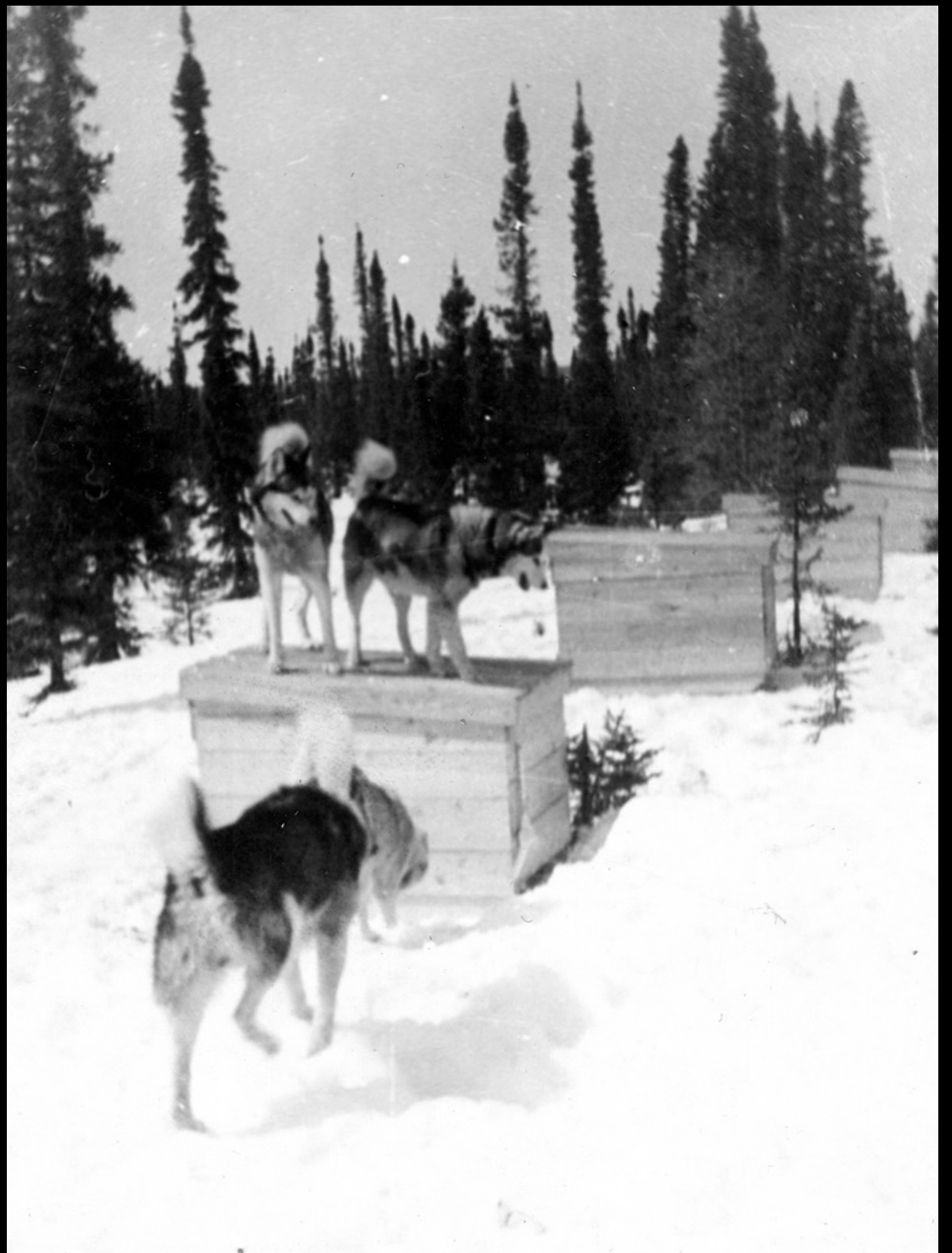

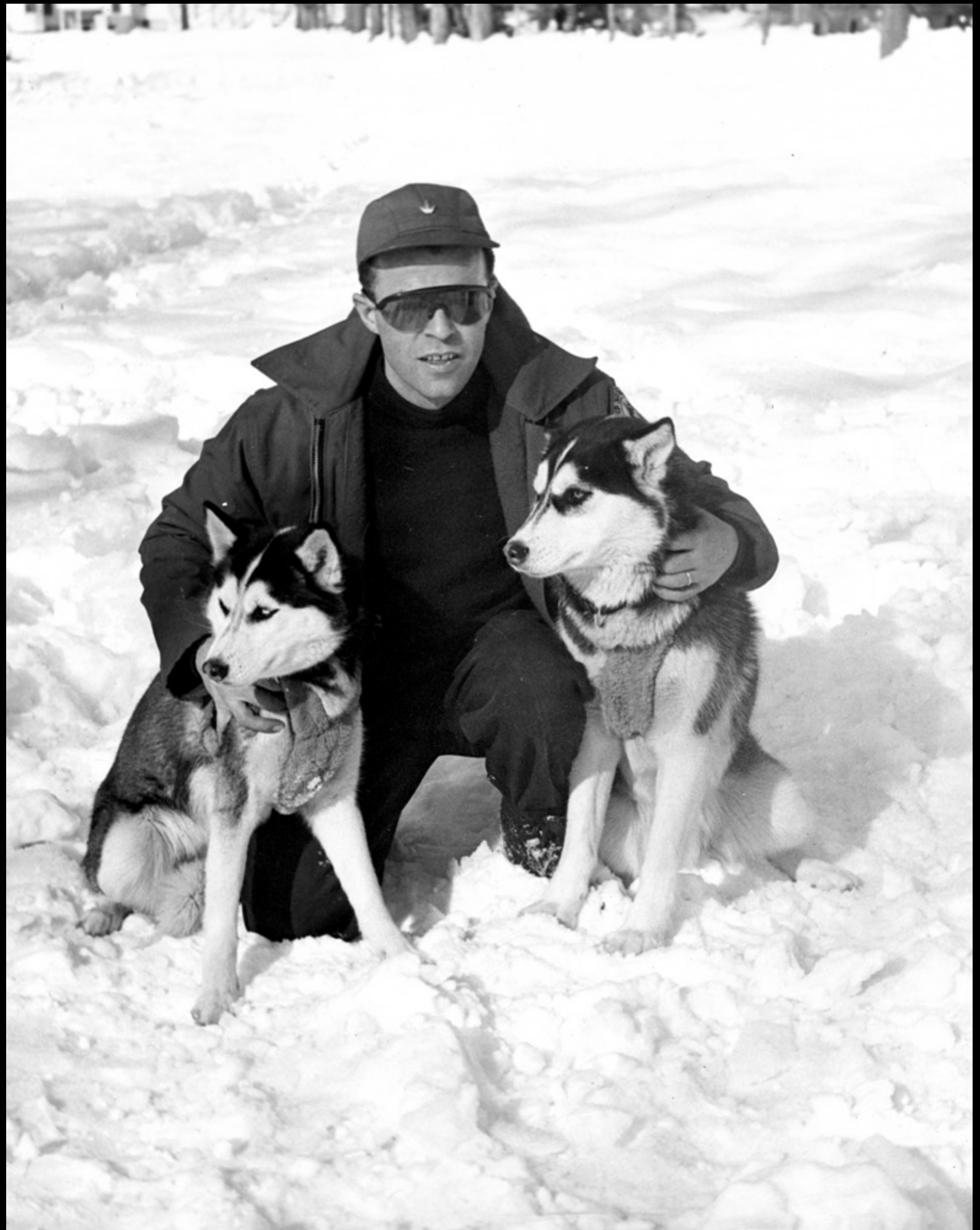

On SLED DOGS

WHAT can compare with the slant eyes, wolf howl, and stolid expression of the Husky? What animal possesses the endurance under exposure, the perseverance at his work, and the instinct for pulling in his harness? Everyone gets a thrill from the picturesque sight of a dog team loping on mile after mile with that strange diffidence peculiar to this dog of the North. When he fails to do exactly what we expect of him, let us bear in mind that he does not have the constant association with human beings that our house dogs do, and let us recall the innumerable instances when he has helped us through difficulties with phenomenal intelligence. Some people believe that the handling of sled dogs involves severe and even rough treatment. This is not the case, as they readily respond to patience and consideration from their owners or drivers.

The New England Sled Dog Club was formed in 1924, largely through the efforts of Arthur T. Walden of Wonalancet, one of our greatest trainers and drivers. Unless you are willing to be bitten by this bug of dog driving, do not let him relate to you his experiences in Alaska and Little America or, for that matter, in our own White Mountains, for he will thrill you with an unescapable desire to get behind a dog
